NZEI and Ministry of Education are still negotiating for the teacher's collective agreement. The Ministry of Education's latest offer has been rejected and the NZEI membership has voted for rolling strikes to take place around the country for one week. Our Board have decided to close the school for instruction on Tuesday November 13th as this date is designated as the strike day for the Waikato. Please note that strikes may be called off if all parties come to an agreement prior to Monday 12th November. We will keep you informed should this happen.

I am conscious this may cause some concerns about child care but we appreciate your support with this matter as the profession is in real crisis which cannot be ignored any longer.
